Message From the President

Dear Members, Partners, Donors, and Friends,

Together, we have marked the second year of Impact 100 Seattle, continually listening, learning and evolving, guided by the principles of Trust-Based Philanthropy. We have pivoted multiple times to ensure our relevance to our communities and the broader membership ecosystem. In addition to



growing our membership, we have focused on deepening our engagement, as we connect, inspire, and educate women, while fostering relationships with our grantee partners. Our members are taking note, giving time, money, and resources to our partners as well as organizations we've met along the way.

Over the past 2 years we have collectively granted 225,000 dollars in unrestricted funds to eight small, local, community-based organizations. The majority of them are run by women of color, and all are founded and led by people from the communities that they serve. As a collective of women, we have learned and challenged our assumptions about what is the right way to give back.

As we stride into our third year, our chapter is embarking on a strategic planning process to provide a road map for our organization to follow as it further establishes itself. Bringing more community voices to the table is a commitment imbedded within our expanded Impactship program as well as with representation from our Grantee Partners on the Grant Leadership Team and the Board of Directors. We look forward to another fruitful year within an organization that is shaped by its members--women who are open, critical, and always strive for more.

I am grateful to our members, friends, and especially our grantee partners who are the ones that are doing all the hard work. I want to extend a special thank you to my friend and co-founder, Anne, whose time connecting, sharing resources, and knowledge is invaluable. Although she has recently relocated from Seattle, she will remain a part of our organization forever—for the time being as the chair of the Communications Team. 

Impact 100 Seattle--How It Works

Impact 100 Seattle is a women's collective giving organization that supports transformational change through unrestricted grants for community-based organizations serving the Puget Sound Region.

Each year, we aim to partner with a small number of local nonprofit organizations and support them with unrestricted grants. One of these organizations will receive a \$100,000 grant, paid over the course of 1-3 years. In addition to providing funding, we aim to support our partners beyond the check by employing the skills, connections, and resources of our diverse membership.

The principles of Trust-Based Philanthropy guide our work and provide an equity lens through which we hope to support the local nonprofit community while addressing some of the unhealthy power dynamics in traditional philanthropy.
